Course Curriculum:

The purpose of this course is to provide exploratory experiences and real-life applications in the biological sciences. The content will include, but not limited to, the following:

- ◆ The nature of science
- ◆ Chemical processes of life: atoms, molecules, and the properties of water
- ◆ Cells: structure, reproduction, and communication
- ◆ Genetics: principles, molecular basis of heredity, diversity, and biotechnologies
- ◆ Biological selection, adaptations, and changes through time
- ◆ Ecology: interdependence of organisms and the environment
- ◆ Microbes, plants, animals, and human structure and function
- ◆ Integrated curriculum: Living classroom presentation: "Enlightenment & Romantic Periods"

We will explore the advances and discoveries of biological concepts during these time periods and present our findings during the living classroom presentations. Every student **MUST** participate at the living classroom presentations.

Materials needed:

- ◆ Planner
- ◆ Biology Portfolio: The portfolio **MUST** be a binder with dividers labeled the following:
Outlines/Notes, Vocabulary, Labs, Research, Journal, and Quizzes.
- ◆ USB Drive with Biology folder
- ◆ Ruler, colored pencils, calculator, and writing utensil
- ◆ **\$10 lab fee** (checks made to IRCHS and the fee must be given to Mrs. Bartol at the Main office (room 10).

Attendance:

Please see IRCHS Attendance Policy. In the event of class being dismissed early to work on projects and breaks for 2-hour classes, you are responsible for abiding by the 7-point contract you signed (on the first page of your planner) while you are not in the classroom.

Grading:

Your grade will be determined on a TOTAL POINTS scale, with no one assignment having more importance than another on a percentage basis; assignments are weighted on the basis of their number of points – so, a 100 point project is ‘worth’ more than a 5 point homework, however you will have more homework than projects. The points all add up, so be sure to DO YOUR WORK, BE PERPARED FOR CLASS, and ATTEND CLASS!

YOUR ROLE:

- ◆ Do your homework each week

- ◆ **Disrupting the class** is defined by talking, not listening, not on task, rude comments, coming in late, and throwing away trash during class.
- ◆ If students **violates** his or her **Charter School Contract** will be removed from class.
- ◆ A cooperative learning approach is used which requires students to work collaboratively to carry structured activities.
- ◆ Fieldwork/field trips are incorporated in Biology so the student can apply his/her knowledge directly to the real world. Students must keep abide by the rules out in the field.
- ◆ **Extra Credit** will be issued when the instructor feels it is necessary, rather than the student feels it is necessary.
